Welcome to our first newsletter of 2018 – it's good to be back after a few months of challenges and change and, as we start to see the days draw out, look forward and think positively as Spring approaches.

This month I am delighted to inform you that the reintroduction of a subsidised handyperson service for Camberley and Frimley has taken a significant step forward.

In doing so, we will soon be able to offer even greater support to the elderly, vulnerable and disabled in our community. Our thanks to all the team at Surrey Heath Carers for making this affordable by donating a significant level of funding.

The new service recognises and addresses problems experienced previously when the cost of operation became prohibitive and a risk to our core car service.

It is a low-cost, low-risk solution that has funding already in place to secure it for the next several years.

We will utilize the services of a local handyperson who is providing a specific number of work hours to Camberley Care each week at a significantly reduced rate.

There are just one or two minor details to top and tail but do look out for more information and confirmation of launch plans in the next couple of weeks.

Developing this initiative from a clean sheet of paper into a proposal took a considerable effort.

Particular thanks to Roy Barnley, Natasha Foster and Derek Laken for their hard work in driving this initiative forward.

As Proud as Punch

For some people, it is making money that provides a sense of achievement. Many of us have probably been in that situation ourselves at some point in our lives. But it's not long before most realise that making a difference is actually what gives a sense of fulfillment. This is what drives many of volunteers and Trustees to join Camberley Care and other local charities.

Our office team recently took a call from the mother of a vulnerable son called Nick. Nick, an avid Arsenal FC fan, likes to keep fit and visits his local gym regularly to keep up his levels of fitness.

Nick has Downes Syndrome and his ability to travel to and from the gym each week was being hampered by security fears, especially during his travel to and from the facility by bus, alone, in the darker winter evenings.

Our reputation may be for providing support mainly to an elderly client base, but when we heard of Nick's challenges and the fears of his mother we were delighted to offer support to be sure the journey to and from the gym each Tuesday is a safe and secure one.

Nick's mum called again a little while later to thank Camberley Care for helping to change Nick's life for the better and enabling him to visit the gym without fear. She is used to fighting hard to win support for her son and could not believe how receptive and helpful our team has been. It was, she said, a huge relief and a weight off her mind.

Nick keeps fit for a good reason. He cycles for charity, not just in the UK but in countries as far afield as Sri Lanka and Israel, always sponsored to do so and always raising valuable funds for those who are in a less fortunate position than himself.

There are many good reasons to believe in the value that Camberley Care provides to the local community, day in and day out. This is certainly one of them.

To our volunteer driver John Devlin who was among the first to get to know Nick and other drivers who have supported him too, thank you!

Car Canes are Here!

Not quite what some of you may be thinking, but a relatively simple but highly effective mobility aid has arrived at Camberley Care. Thanks to recent donations by local church groups, they are now available for volunteer drivers to collect from our office.

You may have seen the Car Cane on television. It can best be described as a portable handle which hooks instantly onto the door latches of any car. After use, it unhooks just as easily and stores away into the door or glove box.

A non-slip grip makes the device comfortable to hold and particularly useful for providing leverage needed a passenger to lift themselves up. It's ideal for anyone with limited mobility.
