This month it is great to be able to lead this edition of our newsletter with some very positive news for everyone involved in Camberley Care Trust and more importantly for the community at large.

After a gap of around 18 months, it is exciting to announce a full relaunch of our subsidised handyperson service to provide a highly valued care and repair service for residents in Camberley and Frimley.

The recently introduced service is made possible by generous funding received from the Trustees of Surrey Heath Carers at the time this local charity ceased operations.

Unlike the service we operated previously, it is both affordable and sustainable, utilizing the services of local handy-people working for a heavily reduced hourly rate.

A soft launch, in operation for a couple of months has now developed into a full-scale relaunch, with a DBS cleared handy-person managed through our office team, using a process, similar to the car service.

Our new service sees clients pay just £20 fixed rate for up to one hour of work and a further £10 for the second, subsidised by Camberley Care funds, plus materials.

As was the case when we operated a similar service in the past, for insurance reasons our handy-person is unable to carry out safety-critical electrical, gas or plumbing work.

Most volunteers will remember the significant financial problems faced by our charity following the withdrawal of Council funding.

It would be remiss of me not to recognize the support of our Board and the dogged determination of office manager Natasha who has gone above and beyond to work this challenge through to completion.

Let's all celebrate this significant success.

The good news does not stop there however. Following a period of nearly one year I am delighted to confirm that we do now have a full time replacement for previous Treasurer Malcom Price identified.

With the wonderful support of interim Treasurer Bryan Dunford we have returned to a strong financial position and, while there can be no room for complacency, the worries of early to mid-2017 are behind us.

Bryan Dunford has possibly been one of the longest serving interim treasurers (anywhere!

He has been invaluable and I sincerely hope he will continue to support our Board of Trustees in some way, No pressure Bryan!

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Parking changes at Aldershot Centre for Health

We have been advised that, yet again, parking arrangements for volunteer drivers visiting Aldershot Centre for Health have changed.

Having parked, drivers must now take their yellow badge to the Health Centre reception where a permit will be issued. This will include your registration number. All drivers must display this permit, along with their yellow badge, in the windscreen of their vehicle.

The new permit is valid for three months so please keep this in mind and keep it safe.

While the permit remains valid, there is no need to report to reception on arrival. Once the three-month period has expired, the above procedure must be repeated.

This information replaces all previous advice on this subject.
