<p>Aldershot Centre for Health Hospital Hill, Aldershot GU11 1AY What3words: ///became.call.maps 0300 614 5000</p>	<p>Aldershot Centre for Health is about half a mile north of Aldershot town centre. There is now automatic number plate recognition (ANPR) in operation in the car parks.</p> <p>The main entrance to the building, from the car park, is on level two.</p> <p>Spaces are very limited so it recommended to drop off and escort the client to reception and give your car registration number to the receptionist. The receptionist has advised that in this case it is okay to park in the road on the double yellow lines as they are not checked, and the car would be registered with the desk.</p> <p>The receptionist will register the vehicle on the system to allow free parking for free parking.</p>
<p>Ashford Hospital London Rd, Stanwell, Ashford TW15 3AA 01784 884488</p>	<p>Two entrances to hospital. Usually wheelchairs are available in both entrances if needed</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. MAIN ENTRANCE – large reception and café opposite 2. OUTPATIENT ENTRANCE – Go immediately to lift to first floor, then you will see outpatient reception <p>Two main car parks – P1 and P2 -barrier operated and take a ticket. Both car parks have a few Blue Badge spaces but the majority are for non Blue Badge.</p> <p>Blue Badge car park – no barrier (about 8 spaces). Remember to display the Blue Badge correctly with time of arrival if possible.</p> <p>Location of car parks – As you enter hospital area via mini roundabout with Tesco superstore on your left:</p> <p>Car park P1 is first right and sharp diagonal right through barrier – take a ticket. Few Blue Badge spaces towards exit barrier of car park.</p> <p>Car Park P2 – without turning right to P1, continue straight on and take next right through barrier, collect ticket. Blue Badge spaces at far end of car park. Exit barrier adjacent to entrance barrier.</p>

	<p>For both car parks at exit barrier, press call button and say you are a volunteer driver (with a Driver on Duty card) and staff should open barrier (no need to use ticket).</p> <p>Separate entrance for Blue Badge parking only..... about 10 spaces. Take first right as if entering P1 but don't turn to barrier, you will see access to BLUE BADGE parking on the right.</p> <p>There are also three spaces just before access to BLUE BADGE PARKING, on the right which are up to 20 min free parking spots.</p> <p>NB: If you park in hospital car park and shop in Tesco while you wait, you cannot push a trolley of shopping over the Tesco boundary!</p> <p>Nearby alternative parking: <i>Tesco - Town Lane, Stanwell Staines, TW19 7PZ</i></p>
<p>East Surrey Hospital Canada Avenue, Redhill, RH1 5RH 01737 768511</p>	<p>Once you have entered the hospital grounds via Canada Avenue, there are two entrances into the hospital building. (Your passenger should know which entrance they need to use according to their appointment letter). Wheelchairs are generally available inside both entrances.</p> <p>MAIN ENTRANCE – you can drop off your passenger at the Main Entrance, which is on the right just after you drive in, turn right off Canada Avenue, just before A&E, and opposite the main car park. There is a large reception area, and a WH Smith with a Coffee House, and an M&S Food to Go on the right as you walk in. There is also a Boots Pharmacy with snacks close to the Main Entrance, opposite Outpatients.</p> <p>EAST ENTRANCE – alternatively, you can drop your passenger off at the East Entrance, so you will need to drive past A&E to the far end of Canada Avenue, and instead of turning left into the main car park entrance, turn right towards the East Entrance. There is a Friends Coffee Shop on the right as you walk in.</p> <p>CAR PARK - All visitors are asked to park in the visitors/public car park, which is located on the left along Canada Avenue, in between the Main Entrance and East Entrance. The entrance to the car park is</p>

at the very far end of Canada Avenue, where you will need to turn left to go through the barriers. A camera will read your number plate when you enter the car park.

Car park pay machines are located at the Main Entrance (opposite Boots), the East Entrance, and in the A&E reception. The pay machines take change, notes, debit and credit cards. **Charges are £5 for up to 2 hours – Driver on Duty cards are NOT accepted.**

You can also pay using the [Trust Parking](#) mobile app. You can connect your credit card and the system will automatically charge you as you leave the car park without having to use the on-site kiosk. The mobile app is available to download to any Apple or Android device. **FREE PARKING** - Alternatively, if you need to wait or your passenger, you can make the short 2-minute drive to Earlswood Lakes on the Woodhatch Road, where parking is free, there are food & drinks and toilet facilities, and you can buy duck food to feed the beautiful ducks and swans.

BLUE BADGE PARKING – There are various disabled parking areas around the East Entrance, next to the visitors’ car park, and in front of and just next to the Main Entrance. Blue badge parking in these areas is free.

Blue badge holders can also park within the visitor car park for free. Take your badge to either the main reception or cashiers who will process the concession. If both are closed, you will need to press the intercom on exiting the car park.

Alerting Epsom hospital that you’ll be parking should be done by sending your visit details by text to the Epsom & St Helier Voluntary Services Department Manager at least 24 hours in advance, to 07775 567968. Receipt of your text will be confirmed.

The details required are:- driver name, name of good neighbours scheme e.g. Dorking Good Neighbours, vehicle registration number and make of vehicle. If you’re likely to use more than one vehicle, give details for each.

	<p>On the day you convey passengers to Epsom hospital, you must text or email your details again, to the above contact, prior to parking. This will enable the Voluntary Services Department Manager's team to put your details onto their 'parking exemption portal'. After dropping off your passenger/s, you must use the public/visitor car park to leave your vehicle, ensuring that you take the ticket on entry.</p> <p>Before leaving the car park, you will need to take your ticket to the Security Office, who will void any payment due (ideally drivers will have some form of identification e.g. lanyard or hi-vis vest). Once voided, you only have 15 minutes to use the ticket to exit the Car Park, before it expires.</p> <p>Locations of Security Offices can be found on the hospitals' site map boards, or on hospital websites, enter 'Epsom St Helier University hospitals' into your browser to find site. Look at 'Plan your journey' for each site map to identify the location of the Security Office. At Epsom - Area B, on ground floor.</p>
<p>Farnham Hospital Manor Road, Farnham, GU9 9QL What3words: ///carry.task.branded 0300 613 8111</p>	<p>Farnham Hospital is a community hospital in Farnham, Surrey. There is one onsite car park. The car park is located at the front of the building and is accessed by the hospital access roads on Manor and Anstey Roads.</p> <p>Parking is free. Blue badge / disabled car parking and a drop off area are all available by the main entrance.</p>
<p>Fleet Hospital Church Road, Fleet , GU51 4LZ What3words: ///marbles.polar.deaf 0300 613 8159</p>	<p>Fleet Hospital is about half a mile from Fleet town centre. Parking at Fleet Hospital is currently free, though spaces are limited. The car park is immediately outside the main entrance.</p>
<p>Frimley Park Hospital Portsmouth Road, Frimley, GU16 7UJ</p>	<p>The main car park is free for the first 20 minutes, after that time to exit the car park volunteer drivers will need to take Driver on Duty</p>

card to the security office outside the main entrance. The ticket will be validated for free parking for volunteer drivers.

The Trust has now rolled out Parking Charge Notice (PCN) at the drop-off area outside main reception. The maximum stay is 10 minutes. Volunteer drivers are advised to report to Security with ID and Security can enter their vehicle details onto the PCN system and will then be able to stay longer than the 10 minutes if help is needed to get a patient to get to their appointment. Please ensure to park in a designated bay and **not on the red double lines or outside ED main entrance** as if not a PCN will be issued.

As you exit the roundabout and enter the hospital grounds you should be in the

- Left hand lane for the Car Parks.
- Right hand lane for the Drop Off Bays.

NB Parking Charge Notices are now issued if Parking Regulations are not complied with.

The Main Car Park is better for the Main Entrance and Entrance C

The Overflow / Car Park B is better for Entrance B – the Eye Dept and Parkside appointments.

Main Carpark

The disabled bays are located closest to the hospital.

Overflow / Car Park B

Overflow / Car Park B is next to the Main Car Park. To access it, once you are in the Main Car Park, go straight ahead and then turn right once you are in the open air. There are Disabled bays in this carpark too.

For **Eye Department Appointments** you will then have to walk the client across the zebra crossing to Hospital Entrance B and back.

Drop Off Bays (outside Main Reception)

Parking is permitted here for **no more than 10 minutes**. However, IF you think that it is going to take you longer than 10 minutes to help

your client out of the car and walk / assist them to Reception or the department you should –

- Leave the client in the car.
- Go to the security kiosk so that the length of your permitted stay may be extended.
- Advise them of your car reg number, show them your ID and Driver on Duty Card. Your vehicle details will then be entered into the PCN system.
- Then go back to your client and take them e.g. to reception.
- Then move your car e.g. to the main car park.

Red Lines - DO NOT stop on double red lines even for one second. Drivers have been fined for just letting the client out of the car (even though the driver did not get out of the car.)

Wheelchairs – They should be located in an area next to the Pay Point in the Main Car Park.

Nearby alternative parking

- Waitrose Car Park– Toilets / free coffee if you have your own cup **BUT** the queue back to the hospital from this direction is often long.
- Toby Carvery Car Park (Portsmouth Road)– Toilets / Coffee to buy or take your own.

NB. Update Oct 2025. The Security Box is being rebuilt and should be completed in January 2026. In the meantime, one of the Security team will be positioned at the Main Reception Desk.

Heatherwood Elective Centre is located in Ascot, near Ascot racecourse and about three miles east of Bracknell town centre, off Kings Ride and is situated between Wexham Park and Frimley Park Hospitals.

Volunteer drivers need to display their yellow Driver on Duty Card for free parking.

<p>Kingston Hospital Galsworthy Road, Kingston upon Thames, KT2 7QB 020 8546 7711</p>	<p>Parking at the hospital site is very limited and you should allow yourself plenty of time to find a parking space. At busy times, there may be queues for spaces. Kingston Hospital operates a pay on exit system. You can pay for parking at one of the many parking payment machines located around the hospital site.</p> <p>Blue Badge Holders Parking is free for disabled badge holders. Take your disabled badge with you, scan it at a machine on the way into the hospital, and keep it with you until you leave. Once you have scanned your Blue Badge, there is no need to display it in your car.</p> <p>Audiology department only Volunteer drivers taking clients to appointments in the audiology department ONLY can park for free. The procedure when arranging parking for audiology appointments at Kingston, is for the driver (or Duty Officer) to email BOTH:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Krft.carparking@nhs.net AND • Krft.aqpaudiology@nhs.net <p>in advance of the appointment, with the appointment date and time, make and model of the car and registration number and reference the name of the scheme.</p> <p>This hospital is in the ULEZ zone.</p>
<p>Royal Berkshire Hospital Reading Craven Road, Reading RG1 5LF 0118 322 5111</p>	<p>Park in hospital multi-storey car park, adjacent to the Main Entrance in Craven Road (just off the London Road). Take a ticket from the machine to enter. After parking, take ticket to Reception on level 2 to get it validated. Show your name badge and yellow Driver on Duty card. Display the yellow Driver on Duty card on your dashboard.</p> <p>Disabled parking is on level 0 or level 2 (where the main reception</p>

	<p>and drop-off is situated). You can use a client's Blue Badge - leave the timed part of this on the dashboard. You still need to get the car park ticket validated.</p> <p>Blue Badge holders and Volunteer Drivers get unlimited free parking. Note that finding a space can take a long time.</p> <p>Use of disabled bays for set down and pick up only, unless you have a blue badge.</p>
<p>Royal Marsden Hospital (Sutton) Downs Rd, Sutton SM2 5PT 020 8642 6011</p>	<p>To facilitate parking validation, drivers must report to the Main Reception Desk or Oak Cancer Centre Help Desk with their badges.</p> <p>The receptionist on duty will validate your parking upon presentation of the badge and their car registration. This process needs to be repeated daily, with each validation being valid for the entire day. <i>N.B. This appears to work but has not been formally agreed with Surrey Community Action.</i></p> <p>If you make multiple trips to the hospital in a day, they should validate parking each time they enter and exit.</p> <p>The car park operates on an ANPR system, and no tickets are required for parking (unless there are camera issues).</p> <p>This hospital is in the ULEZ zone.</p>
<p>Royal Surrey County Hospital Egerton Rd, Guildford GU2 7XX 01483 571 122</p>	<p>Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR) operating at all car parks.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Where possible, please use the 20 minutes dedicated drop off spaces at the front of the hospital • If the 20 minute drop off bays are in use and you need to assist the patient safely into/out of the hospital, please find a safe place to stop or a parking bay. • If parking, please present your Driver on Duty card to the parking office for parking fee to be waived.

- Driver on Duty cards are **not** permitted for use in Blue Badge bays.
- After assisting the patient, **please move your vehicle off-site** (see nearby alternative parking)

Plan for Pick-Up

- Coordinate pick-up timing with the patient or hospital staff when the patient is ready to leave
- Keep phone contact if needed to avoid long waiting times

Blue badge holders

Free parking in any bay for blue badge holders only. Blue Badge holders **MUST** register at the parking office for a daily permit. (Registration can be before or after the appointment but must be the same day.) <https://www.royalsurrey.nhs.uk/blue-badge-parking>

1. MAIN ENTRANCE - off Gill Avenue with hospital on right, take first turning on right signposted A and E. Follow road to the left and MAIN ENTRANCE is on right. Three 20 minute diagonal car park spaces for drop off/pick up. Care needed as ambulances, taxis, police cars and buses coming and going.

Two large visitor car parks can be accessed from Gill Avenue, follow sign to visitor car park (BLUE BADGE and non blue badge parking). Can walk down steps from car park to main entrance.

2. SIDE ENTRANCE (west wing entrance for audiology and eye clinic). Far right side of hospital - drive past main entrance and take right fork down and road winds to the right. Entrance is on the right, opposite post education centre. There are two 20 minute drop off/pick up spaces there but parking in the area is all BLUE BADGE. Exit this area by continuing to follow road around to the left, through gate, turn left into the research park and first exit on roundabout takes you onto Gill Avenue, passed the hospital on left.

3. St Lukes Cancer centre – has own car park which includes BLUE BADGE spaces. Its main entrance is just beyond SIDE ENTRANCE. Cancer patients will be issued with a permit that allows free parking.

4. Day Surgery unit e.g. cataract surgery. Entrance from Egerton Road (left side of hospital) at roundabout, follow signs to day surgery which is at the back of the hospital. Has its own car park with a few blue badge spaces.

5. Short stay surgical unit - no drop off point in front but if client mobile, can drop at main entrance and direct client to walk to the far right hand corner of hospital green sign to short stay surgical unit. Then park in one of the main car parks at front of hospital by driving past the main entrance and taking left fork slightly uphill with signs to enter main car parks. Alternatively, if your client does not need to be accompanied, drop the client at the appropriate entrance, give client a contact number and then drive to alternative parking. Client /clinic will ring when ready to be picked up.

Before leaving the hospital, take the car park ticket to the Security Office in the main hospital (next to M&S). Show the Driver on Duty Card and lanyard and they will validate the ticket.</p> <p><u>Blue Badge parking</u> Disabled parking is available free of charge to drivers displaying a disabled driver's permit in:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • any of the reserved disabled spaces available near the entrances of each of the hospital wings. • any white-painted bay on the perimeter road around the hospital. <p>St. Peter's Hospital Guildford Rd, Lyne, Chertsey KT16 0PZ 01932 872000</p>	<p>All patient car parks are now ANPR (Automatic Number Plate Recognition).</p> <p>Main Multi-storey car park Location After entering hospital grounds from Guildford Rd, at first mini roundabout turn right, drive past car park for staff on left, bus parking stops and drive up to one of two barriers of multi storey. No ticket issued. Visitors can park on Level 2 and 2.5 but you need to exit by foot at level 2 to enter the main entrance of the hospital. (Car park- lift and steps available)</p>

Exit car park by foot across zebra crossing and into main entrance where reception can guide to outpatients and other departments etc.

If taking **non blue badge holders**, park in non blue badge space and at end of appointment , go to main reception with your yellow driver on duty card and reception will give you a ticket which you can put into the exit barrier slot on leaving the car park. The barrier will then open. **NB** don't worry if date on printed ticket does not correspond to the correct date. It should still work.

BLUE BADGE PARKING ON LEVEL 2. Blue badge spaces can be found on level 2. Display blue badge.

Wheelchairs sometimes available in car park near walking exit (Level2) by electric charging points. Otherwise can be found in main reception just to right of escalator, opposite small shop. Alternatively there may also be wheelchairs opposite the porters office (ask someone for directions).

For those with a BLUE BADGE, before leaving you can either enter your number plate at the ticket machine and then scan the blue badge which will entitle you to free parking. Then drive out of car park and barrier will register your number plate and open automatically.

Alternatively you can just drive to the exit barrier and scan blue badge and barrier should open.

Note some levels have staff parking only.

MAIN ENTRANCE is on level 2. Small shop, cafeteria, toilets and main reception.

Rowley Bristow entrance (Fracture Clinic)

You need to park in a different car park to access this unit which is next to A & E.

Once you enter hospital grounds, at mini roundabout go straight (following signs to A and E) . Follow the main road as it winds to the right and take the immediate left. The road will wind to the right, pass staff car park and take next right with barrier for visitor parking. Number plate recognition in operation. No ticket issued.

BLUE BADGE PARKING is at the top of the car park, once you pass barrier, bare left and go straight to end (short distance) and turn left and left again. You will see BLUE BADGE spaces, next to the road. Once parked with blue badge displayed, follow signs to Rowley Bristow unit on foot. Once inside, use stairs or lift to first floor where you will see a reception and large waiting area.

When exiting the above car park, you can enter your car registration and scan BLUE BADGE for free parking at the ticket terminal near the entrance barrier of the car park or just SCAN BLUE BADGE at the terminal exit barrier. (Follow signs to exit of car park which is on the slightly lower level of the car park. Once you turn right out of this car park, you turn left and you will see way out of hospital.

If client is mobile, you can drop them in front of Rowley Bristow unit which is double yellow line but you CANNOT park there even with hazard lights to accompany client into building. In order to drive in front of Rowley Bristow unit, once you have entered hospital grounds at mini roundabout, go straight across and follow road as it winds to the right (don't take immediate left). Keep going uphill and you will see A and E as you turn left at top of hill and Rowley Bristow entrance further along, opposite the mini roundabout.

Drop-off only

Finally if you are just dropping a client at the **main entrance** of the hospital and they are making their own way home, you can either enter the barrier main car park and go to level 2 near the ticket machine and zebra crossing, letting them out there or you can drop them right outside the main entrance where the patient transport ambulances stop, by driving as if you are going to Rowley Bristow unit but turning immediately right instead of going up the hill

towards A and E. Then exit via level 1 of main car park through barrier which will open if under 20 mins.
NB when going down to level 1 from level 2 to leave the car park, please note that cars may suddenly approach from your left.

The hospital operates two parking systems:

- **Pay on foot:** The main car park at the front right of the hospital is a ticketless ANPR (Automatic Number Plate Recognition) barrier system. Cameras register the number plate of the car before entry. Before leaving the hospital, you will need to enter your number plate into one of the pay machines which are located in the entrance of the main building and pay the requested fee. Once the car parking charge for the registered number plate has been paid, the camera at the barrier will automatically recognise the number plate of the car and open the barrier accordingly.
Please note: if you park in the barriered “pay on foot” car park you must pay for parking.
- **Pay and display:** Pay and display spaces are sign-posted around the hospital. A valid ticket must be clearly displayed at all times. Drivers must display their yellow Driver on Duty Card at all times when in the pay and display car park for free parking. This is located to the left of the entrance to the hospital by Queen Mary Maternity Unit.

Drop-off point

There is a drop off point directly in front of the main hospital building. Drivers may drop off elderly and disabled patients outside the main entrance however parking in this area is not permitted.

Blue Badge parking

Blue badge patients and visitors receive free parking for the duration of their attendance at, or visit to, the hospital. There are 32 disabled

	<p>car parking bays across all site parking facilities—20 bays in the main car park, 3 in the Queen Mary Maternity Unit car park, 8 adjacent to the Urgent Care Centre and 7 on the north side of Marjory Warren Unit. Please note you must display a valid blue badge permit to park in the designated disabled bays.</p> <p>If you park in the main car park and have a blue badge, you will need to apply for concessionary parking prior in advance to attending the hospital in order to exit the car park at no charge. More information here: https://www.chelwest.nhs.uk/your-visit/getting-here/west-middlesex-university-hospital</p> <p>This hospital is in the ULEZ zone.</p>
<p>Wexham Park Wexham, Slough, SL2 4HL What3words: ///expert.toast.giving 0300 614 5000</p>	<p>Wexham Park Hospital is about two miles north of Slough town centre on the corner of Wexham Street and Church Lane / Wexham Park Lane.</p> <p>Go through Gate 2 and park in Car Park A – drivers need to display your Driver on Duty Card.</p>
<p>Woking Community Hospital Heathside Road, Woking GU22 7HS 01483 715911</p>	<p>Volunteer drivers can park for free - please see Lanre Shaw on site to waiver their parking. This needs to occur at the end of their visit, and on every attendance to Woking Community Hospital.</p> <p>Lanre is situated in the car park office, opposite the old main reception. Should Lanre not be available, drivers (or the scheme) should email surrey.estates@property.nhs.uk the same day of the visit, with the name of the scheme, car reg and an explanation that they are a volunteer driver on duty requesting that their car park charge is waived.</p> <p>There is no barrier or ticket to take as it is number plate recognition parking.</p> <p>The car park now has 12 BLUE BADGE spaces near the new diagnostic unit. You will need to scan your client's blue badge at one of the car park terminal points before exiting the car park.</p>

Entrances

Diagnostic Unit Entrance- closest to car park.

You can access all departments at Woking Community hospital from the diagnostic unit. There is a lift from the diagnostic unit reception which opens up into the main hospital. Then follow signs to all departments.

Walk In Centre / Outpatients Entrance – if dropping off turn left at T junction in front of hospital. It is on the right. All double lines so no PARKING ALLOWED.

Wheelchairs are usually available at the walk in centre entrance. Not sure about diagnostic unit

Main Woking community hospital entrance - this remains open next to diagnostic unit but not as easily accessible to the car park as the diagnostic unit. Wheelchairs usually available.

Please note: Driver on Duty cards can only be used as per the notes above. They are NOT valid in disabled bays or other restricted areas such as yellow/red lines unless specified. **Surrey Community Action is not consulted upon nor advised by any of the hospitals or trusts about changes to parking arrangements for volunteers or Blue Badge holders – this information is updated as soon as we are aware of any changes.**
